#### Corinthians Third in Div.II

As of this writing, and with 1 Super League game played so far, 4 more to play, the Corinthians are in third place in the Second Division. Played 12, Won 7, Lost 4, Tie/No Result 1, for 75 points. In the 2 matches since the last Newsletter, Corinthians have beaten Hollywood II by 153 runs. Corinthians 254 for 6 (45 overs), **Imran Ahmed 104, M. Abba Ali 100**. Hollywood 141 all out, **Asif Idrees 4 for 37**. This was followed by a poor match against Caribbean I, which was lost by 4 wickets, but more importantly resulted in a negative report to the SCCA regarding the (unacceptable) behavior of the Corinthian players. #### Casuals Fourth in Div.III

As of this writing, and with 2 Super League games played, 3 more to play, the Casuals are in fourth place in the Third Division, with a record of Played 13, Won 6, Lost 6, Tie/NR 1, for 65 points. In the 2 matches since the last newsletter, Casuals beat Cal-Bel by 3 wickets. Cal-Bel scored 186 for 8 (40 overs), and Casuals replied with 187 for 7, an innings highlighted by a match-winning unbeaten eighth wicket partnership of 53 runs, by **Rameez Ali** and Captain **Phil Traynor**, which saw us home with 8 balls to spare. Unfortunately, this was followed by a poor performance against the league leaders, Inland Empire I. IE made 198 for 9 (40 overs), to which Casuals could only manage 78 runs in reply.

##### Prior Bylaws Section II:

##### THE EXECUTIVE

The officers of the Corinthian Cricket Club Executive shall consist of:

A. President, B. Vice President, C. Corresponding Secretary, D. Recording Secretary, E. Treasurer, F. Immediate Past President.

##### Approved addition to Section II:

The Executive shall be the governing body of the Club, and shall act as the Club's agent, responsible for managing the Club's transactions, affairs and properties. The Executive shall have the sole authority to execute decisions regarding the legal, financial, social and public, affairs of the Club. Except in instances of an individual's extended absence from the affairs of the Executive, all decisions in such matters must be decided by a two-third majority vote of the full Executive. The President shall act as a fully vested participant in the voting process.
